

Aug./Sept	Chapter 1 Divine Revelation: How God makes himself known through Divine Revelation and how that Revelation is handed down to us. Students will also begin familiarizing themselves with the names of the books of the Old Testament. Special emphasis on the Pentateuch. Chapter 2 Creation: What is the central theme of Genesis? <i>That</i> God created the universe and is the source of all life. What do we mean when we say humans are created in God's image? A small project on the Saints is assigned in this chapter.	Standards
<u>Oct./November</u>	<u>Chapter 3</u> Original Sin: A look at original sin and the resulting consequences of evil entering the world, as well as the promise that God would send a savior to redeem us. A small research project is assigned in this chapter.	<u>Standards</u>
