American History Course Description:

Students in eighth grade will continue to build on the fourth and fifth grade introductions to North Carolina and the United States by embarking on a more rigorous study of the historical foundations and democratic principles that continue to shape our state and nation. The focus of this course will be the critical events, personalities, issues and development in the state and nation from the Pre-Revolutionary Era to Contemporary times. We will also study the relationship of geography, events, and people to the political, economic, technological, and cultural developments that shaped our existence in North Carolina and the United States over time.

Materials needed for everyday class:

Class expectations:
