Class Description: This language arts class is designed to increase your communications skills through reading, writing, speaking, and the study of the English language. Our primary focus in language arts class will be mastery of different writing styles, demonstration of the rules of grammar, and the ability to express yourself orally.

This year you can expect to read a variety of fiction and non-fiction including novels, short stories, dramas, poetry, and essays. These writing pieces will model the different writing styles we will be working on ourselves. Writing assignments will include timed responses, book reports, poetry, essays, critiques, and creative pieces. Vocabulary, spelling, and grammar assignments will also be an important part of this class. Because we are a community of learners, please also expect to work periodically in group situations and to present information to your peers in groups or individually.

Please understand that at-home reading is expected and is a component of our course. You will be held accountable for at-home reading by various methods.

Our major units of study will include but are not limited to:

Narrative
Expository(Descriptive, Explanation, Comparison/Contrast,Problem Solving)
Technical Writing (Friendly Letters, Thank You Notes, Instructions)
Persuasive Writing/Speech and Delivery
Poetry
Short Stories (Fluency and Construction)
Vocabulary
Grammar

*Throughout all of our writing, we will also utilize the multi-step writing process to develop, revise, evaluate, and improve our products. In our course of study in all the units, we will address the various elements of specific genres (including but not limited to organization, purpose, audience, narration, conflict, sound, graphics, tone, and theme).

Projects: 6th, 7th, and 8th graders will have either a project or a test after each novel that is read in class. Each grade will have a major project that will be presented at the end of May. These projects will be announced in October.

Reading/Book Reports: Each trimester the students will choose two books, within their Lexile range, to read. Each book will be from a specific genre. Upon reading the book, the students will complete a 'Book Report Form' to pass in for a grade. The book report assignments are counted as test grades. In the first trimester, the students will read one historical fiction and one science fiction. In the second trimester, the students will read one action adventure and one fantasy, and in the third trimester, the students will read one action adventure and one fantasy. The students will receive the book report forms and instructions within the first week of school.

Grading Policy: In our class, you will be graded informally and formally each day, using several different types of assessments.

Returned Work:

All work will be graded and returned in-class in a timely manner. Please allow a while longer for lengthier writing assignments. Students will have an opportunity to review their graded work, and then they will be asked to file the assignments into their English or Literature Binders.

Assignments: All assignments must be submitted by the given due date and are due at the <u>beginning</u> of the class period unless otherwise stated. Per the student handbook, a student, who does not have their assigned work will be

given a demerit. Missing/late assignments will lose 10% per day, with a maximum of five school days. After five school days, no late work will be accepted, and a zero will be recorded for that assignment. It is the student's responsibility to check with the teacher regarding any late/missed assignments and their due date. If a student is absent the day an assignment/project is due or a test is given, the assignment/project will be handed in or the test will be taken on the day the student returns to school. The absent student is responsible for gathering missed assignments upon their return to school. A student will have two days to make up missed work for everyday he/she was absent. Each grade will have a make up work folder in the back of the room next to windows. There will be one folder per grade. Students will place assignments that were missed in his or her appropriate grade folder. Missing a test review does not exempt a student from taking a test. Students should notify teachers of a planned absence.
