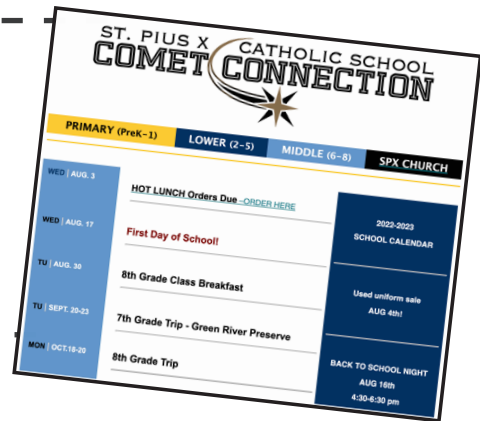
Where / How to Find Information

Communication

- SPX Catholic School believes that parent/teacher communication is extremely important. Teachers can be contacted via e-mail or voicemail. Teachers' e-mail addresses are available on the SPX School website and through FACTS/RenWeb.
- Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled at the end of the 1st trimester. Teachers will schedule pre-K through 5th grade conferences with parents. Middle School parents may drop in during planned conference times. Additional conferences may be scheduled at the request of administration, teachers, or parents, as needed, throughout the school year.

Comet Connections is our schoolwide newsletter that is sent to parents and 6-8 grade students every Saturday morning. Comet Connections is our primary means of communication with our families regarding upcoming events and deadlines. The newsletter is divided into Primary (PreK-1), Lower (2-5), and Middle (6-8) schools sections.

It is important that everyone read the schoolwide section in addition to reading their child's specific section so as not to miss out on important dates and events!



Thursday Folders are sent home each Thursday and are to be returned to school the following day. Thursday Folders contain graded papers and other classroom/school information, some of which require parent signatures. Most school information, however, will be communicated through newsletters, school e-mail blasts, or the parent alert text system.

What does the PTO do?

With the support of the students and all PTO members, we hold several events throughout the year and support the school and administration in many others. All fundraising and other donations collected throughout the year directly benefit the students, teachers and staff, school buildings, and equipment. Thanks to the generous financial contributions from the SPX community, the 2021-2022 PTO was able to make unplanned contributions to the school totaling \$42,000:

\$26,000 for 1 new iPad and 1 new Chromebook cart (including 30 machines/cart)
\$9,000 for new STEM equipment for media center & STEM lab
\$7,000 for new flooring in the music room

Volunteering and Visiting

- Volunteers and visitors must sign in and sign out in the appropriate school office when entering and exiting the building. All volunteers and visitors will wear a visitor or volunteer name tag throughout their visit. All volunteers and visitors must have their temperature checked upon arrival.
- All volunteers and regular visitors must have taken the Protecting God's Children course (www.virtus.org) and must have completed a Diocese of Charlotte Background Check in accordance with Diocesan requirements. This includes classroom helpers, readers, lunch volunteers, field trip drivers, classroom party helpers, etc.
- You may register for a workshop at <https://virtusonline.org/virtus/>. Click on the registration link at the left of the screen, then choose Charlotte, NC (Diocese) and follow the steps. Once you complete your workshop, please bring a copy of your certificate to the school. You must also complete a Volunteer Background Check Form that will be available to you online after completing the Protecting God's Children Workshop. Please remember to keep up with the monthly bulletins you will receive after completing the program.
- Field trip drivers must also have a current Volunteer Driver Form on file in the office. Please contact Beth Jones in the main office if you have any questions.

School Nurse | Hours: 8:10 am–3:00 pm daily

- **Medication Policy and Forms (Medication at School):** A doctor's signature is required for all medication dispensed to students while at school, both prescription and over the counter. If it is necessary for either to be administered during the day, please complete the medical form and send it to school with the medication. If a student is allowed to self-administer insulin, and Epi-Pen, or an Asthma inhaler, a Self-Medicating Agreement Form must be completed. All forms are available on the school website.
- **Student Physical Form:** All new pre-K through 8th grade students and ALL 6th grade students are required to have a up to date student physical form and immunization record on file in the school office by the first day of school. The student Physical Form is available on the school website under Resources.

COVID Procedures and Masking

School staff members will be present to direct all carpool lanes. Staff members will also be present to assist students into and out of cars if needed, to assist students walking to or from the main building for the DeJoy carpool, and to ensure the safety of all students.

Carpool lines; New DeJoy students; Late Arrivals / Early Release

The school day begins at 8:10 a.m. with dismissal at 3:15 p.m. Students must be dropped off no earlier than 7:55 a.m.

3-8 Grade Carpool (Front of School)

- This carpool is limited to 3rd grade through 8th grade riders only.
- Enter driveway behind the church on North Elm Street (next to Fountain Manor entrance) and follow around the back of the church to the side of the main school building. A school staff member will direct the car line.
- All students in front carpool will enter the building through the front double doors at the main entrance.

ONLY RIGHT TURNS are permitted when exiting the parking lot during carpool times.

Pre-K–2 and Older Siblings Carpool

- Cars with at least one regular pre-K through 2nd grade student rider are to enter the lower back parking lot using the Cornwallis Drive entrance closest to CVS. A school staff member will direct the car line (4 lines stacked in the parking lot adjacent to the gym).
- Only right turns are permitted when exiting the parking lot during carpool times.
- Students in grades 2-8 will enter the main building through the breezeway double doors after being dropped off. Students in grades Pre K through 1 will enter the De Joy building through its front double doors.

New Pre-K and Kindergarten students

- Parents may accompany Pre-K and Kindergarten students into the DeJoy Primary Education Center on the first three days of school (if needed). Parking is limited due to carpool. (Please park in the lots at the side of the main building. Do not block carpool lanes.) Additional staff members will be on hand throughout the week to accompany younger new students to their classrooms.

Late Arrivals after Morning Carpool and Early Release before Afternoon Carpool

- A parent/guardian must accompany a child(ren) to the appropriate office to sign them into school if arriving after 8:10 a.m.
- A parent/guardian must sign a child(ren) out from the appropriate office when picking them up before 3:10 p.m.
***If a student needs to be signed out of school early, please arrive before 2:40 p.m. to avoid carpool traffic.**

DeJoy Express Carpool

- An express carpool pickup for parents who solely have a child / children at the DeJoy Center runs from 2:45–3:00 p.m. This is for parents who have children in the DeJoy Center only – no children in the main building.
- The express lineup lane will be the lane closest to Connolly Athletic Center (main gym). If you are lining up for the regular carpool, please DO NOT use this far right lane (closest to the gym) until 3:00. From 2:45–3:00, this lane will be reserved for DeJoy Center express carpool pickup.
- Parents who want to participate in DeJoy Center express pickup should notify their child's teacher via email.
- Express Carpool will run the same as regular pickup.

Carpool Map

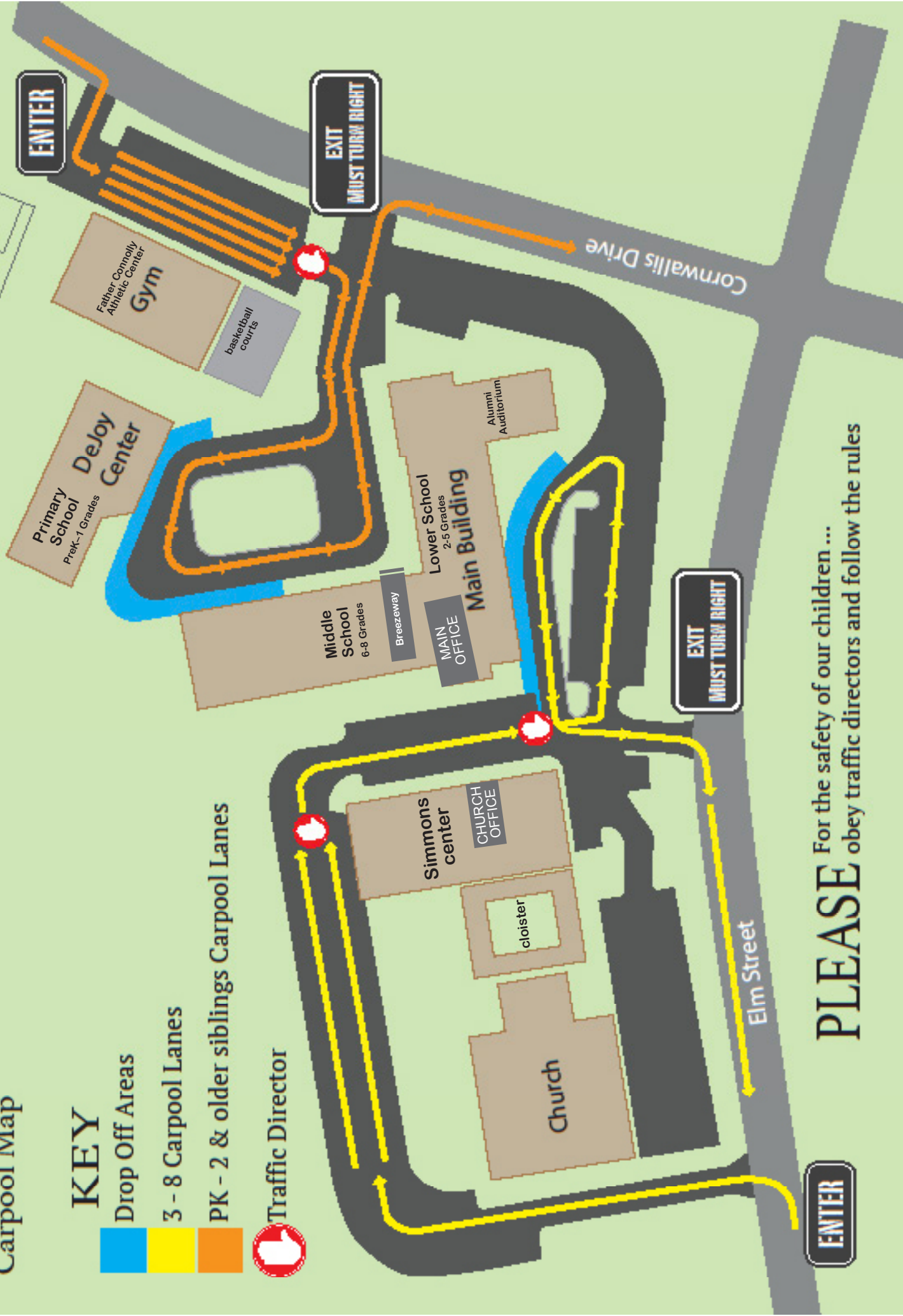
